

WASHINGTON YOUTH TOUR 2012

Each year, three local high school juniors are chosen to represent Palmetto Electric Cooperative in the Rural Electric Youth Tour, a weeklong educational trip to Washington, D.C. The Youth Tour gives students a chance to see government in action, visit historic sites and learn about electric cooperatives.

This year's trip is scheduled for June 16th -21st, and is sponsored by Palmetto Electric and the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association. In addition, The Electric Cooperatives of South Carolina, Inc., will award a \$2,500 scholarship to one of the South Carolina Youth Tour participants. The recipient will be judged on an essay, an interview, and participation during the tour. SAT scores, class standing or grade point average **will not** be considered.

Applicants must meet the following qualifications and entry requirements.

- A. Applicant must be a high school junior.
- B. Applicant must complete an application form, submit **three** letters of reference and **include a recent photograph of yourself.**
- C. If selected as a finalist, applicant must participate in a personal interview.
- D. Applicant's primary residence must be served by Palmetto Electric Cooperative.
- E. Finalists must meet additional requirements in order to compete for the \$2,500 scholarship.

Student Instructions

I. QUALIFICATIONS

- A. Applicant must be a high school junior.
- B. Applicant must complete an application form and contact references.
- C. If selected as a finalist, applicant must participate in a personal interview. The interview portion of the contest is required.
- D. Applicant's primary residence must be served by Palmetto Electric Cooperative.

II. REQUIREMENTS

- A. An application and three letters of reference must be submitted.
- B. A copy of the form entitled REFERENCE and an envelope addressed to Palmetto Electric Cooperative, Inc. should be given to each reference. **References should be returned directly to Palmetto Electric Cooperative, Inc. by Friday, February 29, 2012.**
- C. Letters of reference shall be submitted from business or professional people such as clergymen, lawyers, bankers, farmers, or doctors. **Only one reference may be submitted by a school administrator or teacher.**
- D. References and applications along with a photo should be completed as soon as possible and returned to: **Kristin Keller, Palmetto Electric Cooperative, Inc., P.O. Box 23619, Hilton Head Island, SC 29925**

III. JUDGING

- A. If preliminary judging is necessary, it will be conducted by members of PEC's Women Involved in Rural Electrification, (WIRE). The selection of finalists will be based on information received on the application.
- B. Final judging will be based on school and community involvement, scholastic aptitude displayed, honors and awards received, reference recommendations, poise, communication skills and knowledge displayed in the interview. A panel of judges will ask questions concerning past experiences, future plans, and basic cooperative information. (Thirty percent of the applicant's score will be based on their knowledge of the cooperative program.) **Judging is tentatively scheduled to take place the week of March 12, at Palmetto Electric's facility on Hilton Head Island (111 Mathews Drive). The Youth Tour Coordinator will call each finalist to schedule interview times.**
- C. Three winners will be selected as PEC representatives on the Washington Rural Electric Youth Tour. Alternates will be chosen in case one of the winners is unable to attend the tour.
- D. Winners will be recognized at Palmetto Electric's Annual Meeting in Ridgeland on Saturday, May 5, 2012.

IV. SCHOLARSHIP

If selected as a Youth Tour representative, you will be eligible for a \$2,500 scholarship from the Electric Cooperatives of South Carolina. This organization will contact Youth Tour finalists regarding scholarship requirements.
